Using Bloom's Taxonomy to Write Learning Outcomes ...

Create a scenario in which a character in the story reacts to a problem in your school; write about how he or she would handle the situation differently. As a teacher, you should ensure that the questions you ask both in class and on written assignments and tests are pulled from all levels of the taxonomy pyramid.
