Options for dysphagia intervention include medical, surgical, and behavioral treatment. Biofeedback . Biofeedback incorporates the patient's ability to sense changes and aids in the treatment of feeding or swallowing disorders. For example, patients with sufficient cognitive skills can be taught to interpret the visual information provided by these assessments (e.g., surface electromyography, ultrasound, FEES) and to make physiological changes during the swallowing process.

Treatment depends on the type of swallowing problem you have. Sometimes, a swallowing problem will resolve itself without treatment. On other occasions, swallowing problems can be managed easily.

Dysphagia is the feeling of passing food or liquid from the mouth to the stomach with difficulty. Where most are temporary and non-threatening, dysphagia is caused by quite a few factors. However, in few cases, problems swallowing can be due to more serious medical diagnosis, such as a tumor or a progressive neurological disorder.
