Direct and Indirect Speech Direct and Indirect Speech Rules. In the English language, there are two ways of conveying what someone else has said: direct/quoted speech and indirect/ reported speech. Direct Speech. Direct/quoted speech, involves quoting the exact words uttered by the person, within inverted commas or quotation marks. Direct speech examples:

Direct Speech: the message of the speaker is conveyed or reported in his own actual words without any change.

Direct and Indirect Speech: Rules, examples and exercises

Direct speech repeats, or quotes, the exact words spoken. When we use direct speech in writing, we place the words spoken between quotation marks (" ") and there is no change in these words. We may be reporting something that's being said NOW (for example a telephone conversation), or telling someone later about a previous conversation.

Direct and indirect objects - Easy Learning Grammar. The object of a sentence (if there is one) normally comes after the verb phrase. Whether there is an object or not depends on the meaning of the verb. For example, if you want to talk about what someone is doing, you might say 'She is writing' but if you want to talk about the point of the activity, you might say, 'She is writing a book'.

Grammar rules - If the reporting clause is before the direct speech: We write a comma (,) before the direct speech. We write the exact words inside the inverted commas. The first letter is a capital letter.

Direct speech writing rules in English

He taught me English. In sentence 1, present is the direct object of bought and him is the indirect object. I bought ...what? A present (Direct object) I bought ...to whom? Him (Indirect object) Similarly, in sentence 2, story is the direct object and us is the indirect object. In sentence 3, English is the direct object and me is the indirect object. Notes

Direct and indirect objects. The direct object is the receiver of the action mentioned in the sentence. John hit the ball. (Direct object: the ball) Be careful to distinguish between a direct object and an object complement. They named the boy Christopher. In this sentence 'boy' is the direct object and 'Christopher' is the object complement.

Direct speech. In direct speech, various punctuation conventions are used to separate the quoted words from the rest of the text: this allows a reader to follow what's going on. Here are the basic rules: The words that are actually spoken should be enclosed in inverted commas: 'He's very clever, you know.'

This is called inversion, and it is used to make direct questions in many verb tenses in English, but we don't use inversion in indirect questions. This is very similar to the grammar of reported questions. However, we use indirect questions in a different way from reported questions. Indirect questions are a way of being polite.
