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Put pins in major limbs at angles to prevent from coming loose. 5 cuts with scissors will be used to open up the frog. One long main cut is made in the center along the ventral surface. Followed by four side cuts (two at the top, two at the bottom). Use tweezers to pull back skin and use pins to secure flaps to dissection pan.

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Place the frog in the dissecting pan ventral side up. 2. Use scissors to lift the abdominal muscles away from the body cavity. Cut along the midline of the body to the forelimbs. 3. Make transverse (horizontal) cuts near the arms and legs.
