In India, criminology has drawn relatively lesser attention. Interactions with members of the prison community and messages received from broader society communicate stigmatization and recognition of stigmatization produces internalized consequences of shame, hopelessness/depression, fear, aggression and externalized consequences of perceiving their labeled status as unfair and resenting by those who apply stigmas. **Materials and Methods:**Each group was administered with Criminal Thinking Scale (TCU-CTS; Knight, Garner, Simpson, Morey and Flynn, 2006), Buss Perry Aggression Questionnaire (BPAQ; Buss and Perry, 1992) and Discrimination and Stigma Scale (DISC-12; Thornicroft, 2009). Data was analyzed using descriptive statistics (mean and standard deviation), independent samples t test and Pearson's product moment coefficient of correlation. **Results and Conclusions:**Results indicated that there is a significant difference across gender on domains of entitlement, justification, power orientation, cold heartedness, criminal rationalization, physical aggression, verbal aggression, hostility, overcoming stigma and positive treatment. Also, some specific dimensions correlate with each other for both the groups. the study highlighted how these psychological factors influenced the minds of the selected group.
