"This manuscript-style thesis compiles three papers engaging with different educational ideologies. Two of these papers explore the dominant educational ideologies in North America: state-sponsored education and free market education. The first of these papers explores the historical perspective on the balance between private (household) and public (state) rights in education through an analysis of the societies and educational system of the Ancient Greek city-states of Athens and Sparta. Furthermore, the work of the major philosophers of the time: Plato and Aristotle, are discussed in relation to the families, the states and the role of education. The second paper uses the historical perspective on Ancient Greece to reveal the underpinnings of the current private (free market) and public (state controlled) educational ideologies. Additionally, the paper depicts the ideal educational landscape of each ideology. This paper uncovers the deeper motives of each ideology to better understand the meaning and aims of free market and state-sponsored education. The third paper presents a case-study exploring the factors that pushed a trio of teachers to leave the state-sponsored education system to create an alternative school in Montréal, Québec. Through the voices of the teachers, this case-study explores the tensions between the Québec sponsored education system and the student-centered ideology of the educators. Moreover, the case-study highlights the influence brought about by the teachers' previous experiences in public schools and the impact it has on the design of their new alternative school. The project also calls to attention the risks associated with recreating similar working conditions in their new environment"--
